Five students at the College of William and Mary founded Phi Beta Kappa in 1776 during the American Revolution. For almost 250 years, the Society has embraced the principles of freedom of inquiry and liberty of thought and expression. Laptops have replaced quill pens, but these ideas, symbolized on Phi Beta Kappa's distinctive gold key, still lay the foundations of personal freedom, scientific inquiry, liberty of conscience, and creative endeavor. The UF Chapter (Beta) of Phi Beta Kappa was founded in 1938 by a group of Faculty that included several famous UF and Florida citizens, including Manning Dauer and John Tigert. UF was the second school (now nine) in the state to earn a chapter charter. Since then, thousands of outstanding undergraduate students at UF have been inducted into ØBK.
